

PATHS & ACCESSIBILITY

- The Creeklands are readily accessible via Laburnum or Blackburn train stations, nearby bus stops or bike routes.
- The full circuit walk (gravel) with ample seating is around 3.0 km, easy and relatively flat and will take 30 to 50 mins.
- Dogs are welcome but must be kept on a leash throughout the park and BYO dog bag - please dispose of appropriately!

WILDLIFE & BIODIVERSITY

- Acts as a vital wildlife corridor and biodiversity hub, linking Blackburn Lake Sanctuary and surrounding nature reserves.
- Home to over 50+ bird species including kookaburras, lorikeets, galahs, tawny frogmouths, king parrots, ducks and endangered species like the Gang-gang Cockatoo.
- Supports diverse native plant communities that provide essential habitat and food sources for local fauna.

Blacks Walk



Western end: features remnant bushland, meandering creek, and open grassy areas ideal for picnics and relaxation. Point of interest is an old Manna Gum tree (*Eucalyptus viminalis*).

Kalang Park



Central area: largely indigenous bush, vegetation denser and with multiple billabongs on both sides of creek. Open grass areas for sport and recreation. Point of interest is a 120+ year old English Oak tree (*Quercus robur*).

Furness Park



Eastern end: Smaller park with gently undulating terrain. Point of interest is a recently identified Mountain Grey Gum Tree (*Eucalyptus cypellocarpa*).



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



Blackburn Creeklands

The Blackburn Creeklands is a continuous green corridor following the course of KooyongKoot Creek (Gardiners Creek) through central Blackburn and is made up of three adjoining reserves — Blacks Walk, Kalang Park, and Furness Park. Stretching between Blackburn and Middleborough Roads, it offers a beautiful blend of native bushland and open spaces, ideal for walking, relaxing, family time, exercising and enjoying nature.
